Steven George Mehalko, M.D.

Steven G. Mehalko, M.D., nationally recognized physician and AIDS patient care pioneer passed away January 25, 2019 at his home in San Francisco, California.

Dr. Mehalko was born in 1940 and received his B.S. and M.D. from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He received his M.D. from the University of Illinois at Chicago and completed his residency in Internal Medicine at the University of Illinois at Chicago. He was a member of the Illinois State Medical Society, the American Medical Association, and the American Academy on HIV and AIDS.

Dr. Mehalko worked for the University of Illinois at Chicago from 1975 to 1985, where he was a professor and served as the Medical Director of the Division of Infectious Diseases. He was also the Medical Director of the University of Illinois at Chicago's AIDS Center. He was a member of the Illinois State Medical Society, the American Medical Association, and the American Academy on HIV and AIDS.


Dr. Mehalko spent his final years in San Francisco, where he was a member of the Board of Directors of the San Francisco AIDS Foundation.
